The Baiathak team awaits and looks forward for your support.

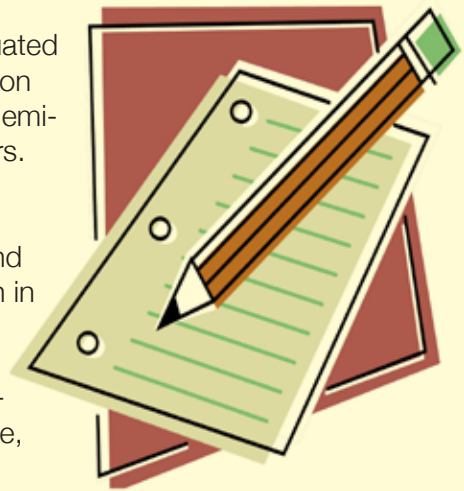

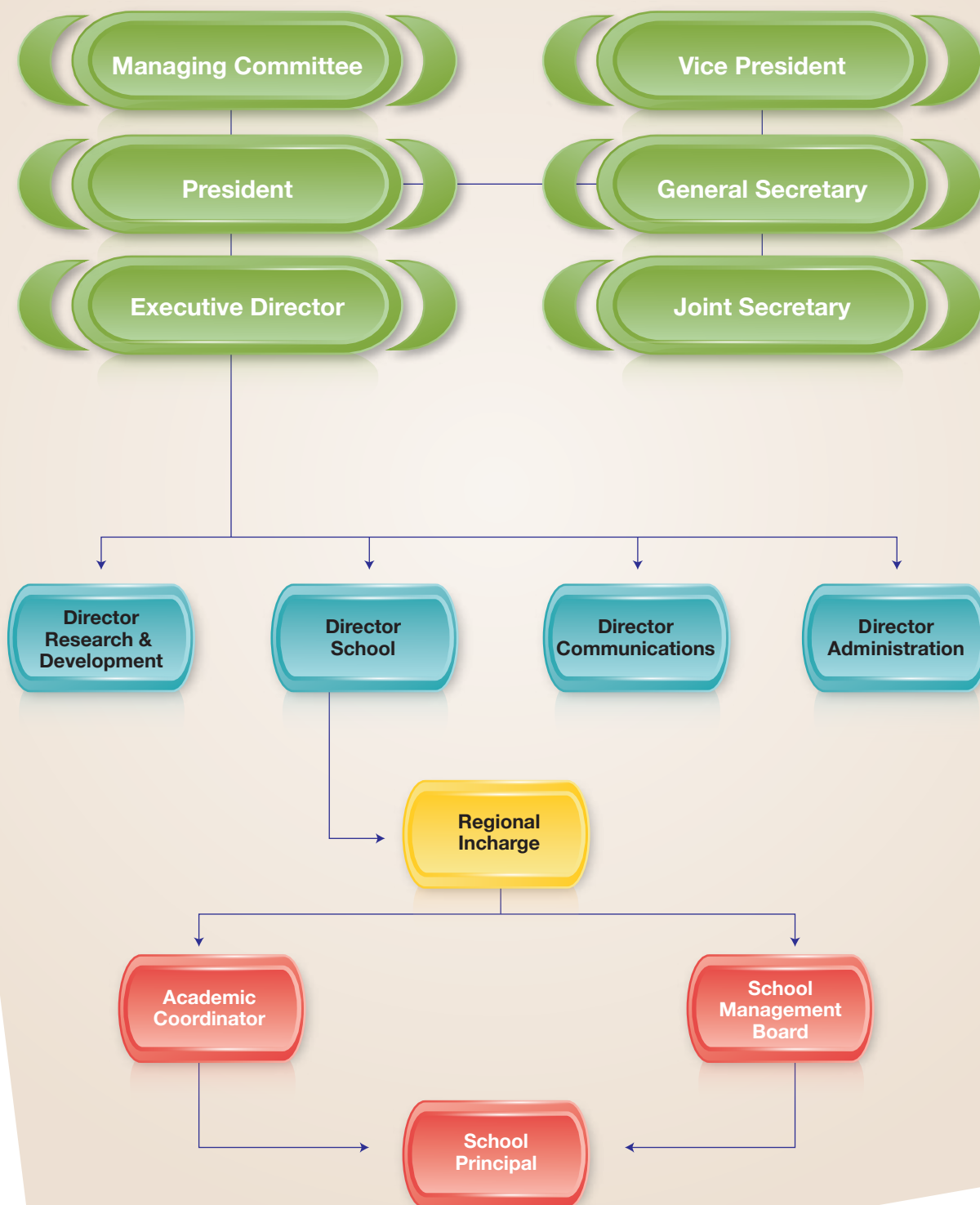

Hierarchy of SEW



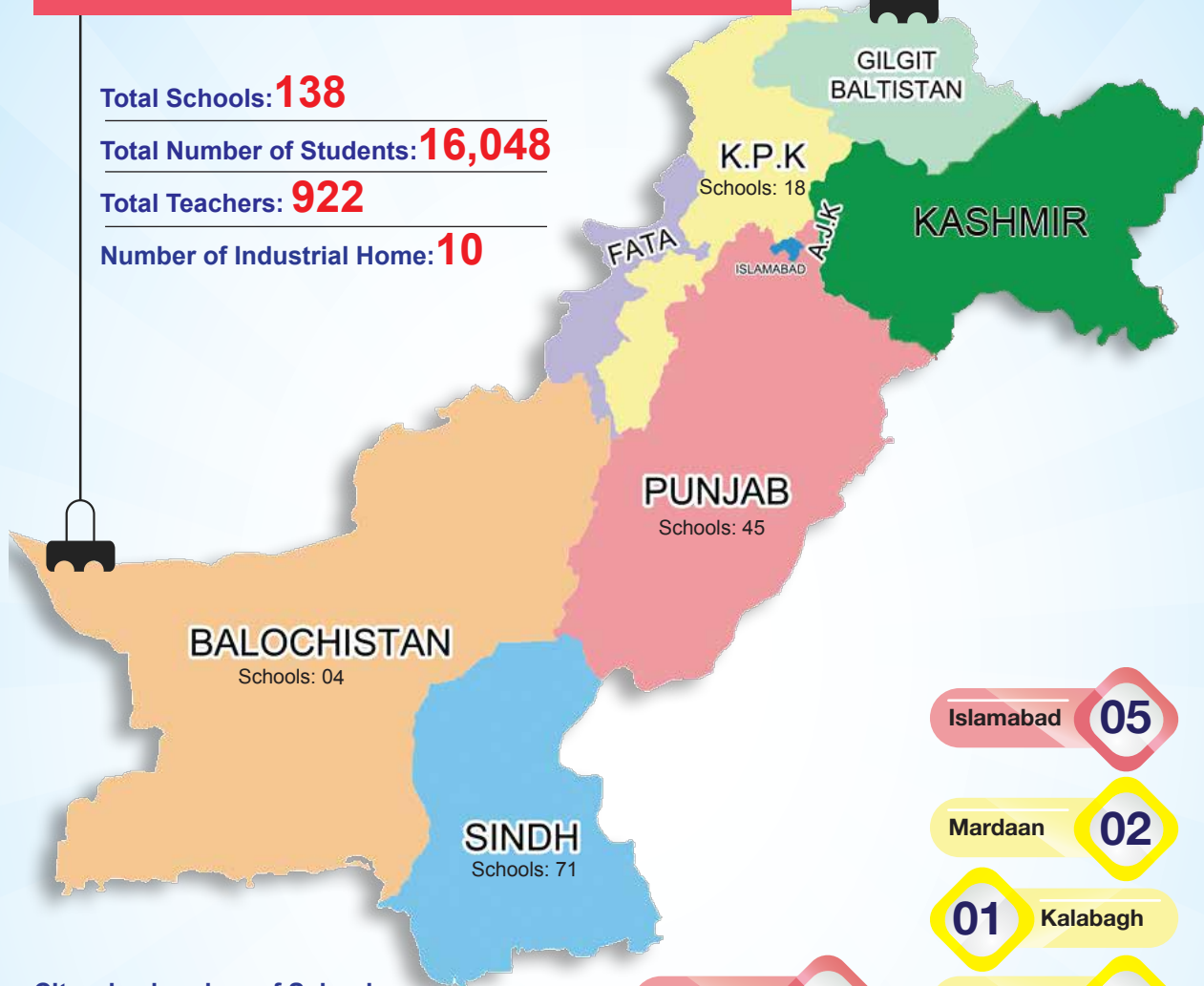

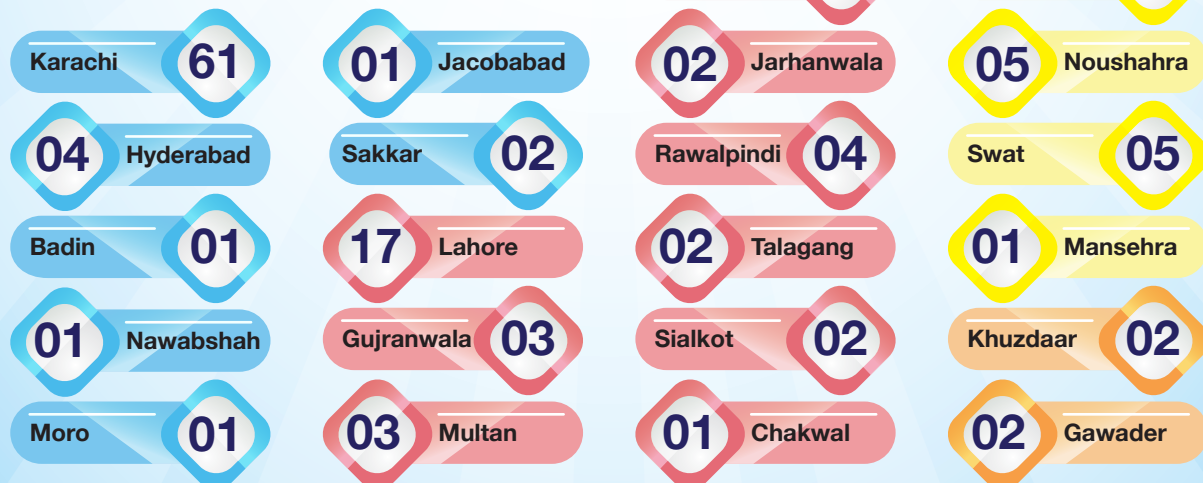

Formal and Informal Education

Educational Awareness in the less privileged urban, rural, politically instable and disaster struck areas is provided by SEW through formal structured age-wise educational setups and informally in camps and tents for internally displaced persons.

Academic Development

Academic research through assessment at ground level formulates our unified syllabus, teacher's capacity building program and other supportive publications. This year the revision of curriculum for the next five years has been planned on the basis of this extensive research.



Training and Capacity Building of Teaching & Non-Teaching Staff

At S.E.W much emphasis is given to the training of Principals and teachers. This year two major Principal training sessions were held in Karachi and one each in Lahore and Peshawar to geographically facilitate all school principals. The attendance was unanimous and the results appreciable. S.E.W salutes HHRD for complete sponsorship and support of this noble cause. Moreover two special 3-day training workshops were held in Karachi for teachers and principals of two recently opened schools at Gawadar. The teachers were also provided literature for further understanding of Islamic values and development of their teaching skills. Further, online sessions for all regions are also in our planning agenda this year.



Vocational Training

S.E.W vocational centres offer 3-6 months courses where girls from lower middle / middle class can develop essential skills such as sewing. It helps acquiring skills to utilize as their source of income.

The Vocational Institutions also add value to Baithak School Network by providing school uniforms to the students at Baithak.



Community Awareness Specially for Mothers

The program offers free counselling to mothers of students at Baithak on monthly basis. Cleanliness, health and hygiene and importance of education are focal topics and have evident marks of improved family life.

This year S.E.W. conducted _____ programs in different regions to build better and prosperous community.

Collaborated Community Development Program

In order to connect these underprivileged students with other students of privileged areas, S.E.W conducts collaborative programs with other private educational institutions and encourage their students to visit Baithak Schools. Such programs help bridge the gaps between students with different mind-sets and are prove to be a great source of learning for new generation.

A six week academic session program was held this year with three Baithak Schools of S.E.W in coordination with Foundation Public School (FPS). It helped to improve and guide students in their academic areas as well as groomed them with extracurricular activities. At the end of this much appreciated CCDP program, a closing ceremony was organized by FPS students presenting their efforts to polish the skills of Baithak Students. FPS students were also awarded with certificates by S.E.W. based on their performance and involvement.

The second phase of library setup started this year after the successful completion of the first phase last year, where new libraries were opened and previous ones reinforced.

16 computer labs were successfully established to equip the children in their I.T skills.



Health and Hygiene

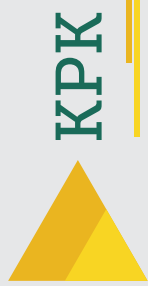

Songs and tableaus presented by BS students caught the attention of visitors.



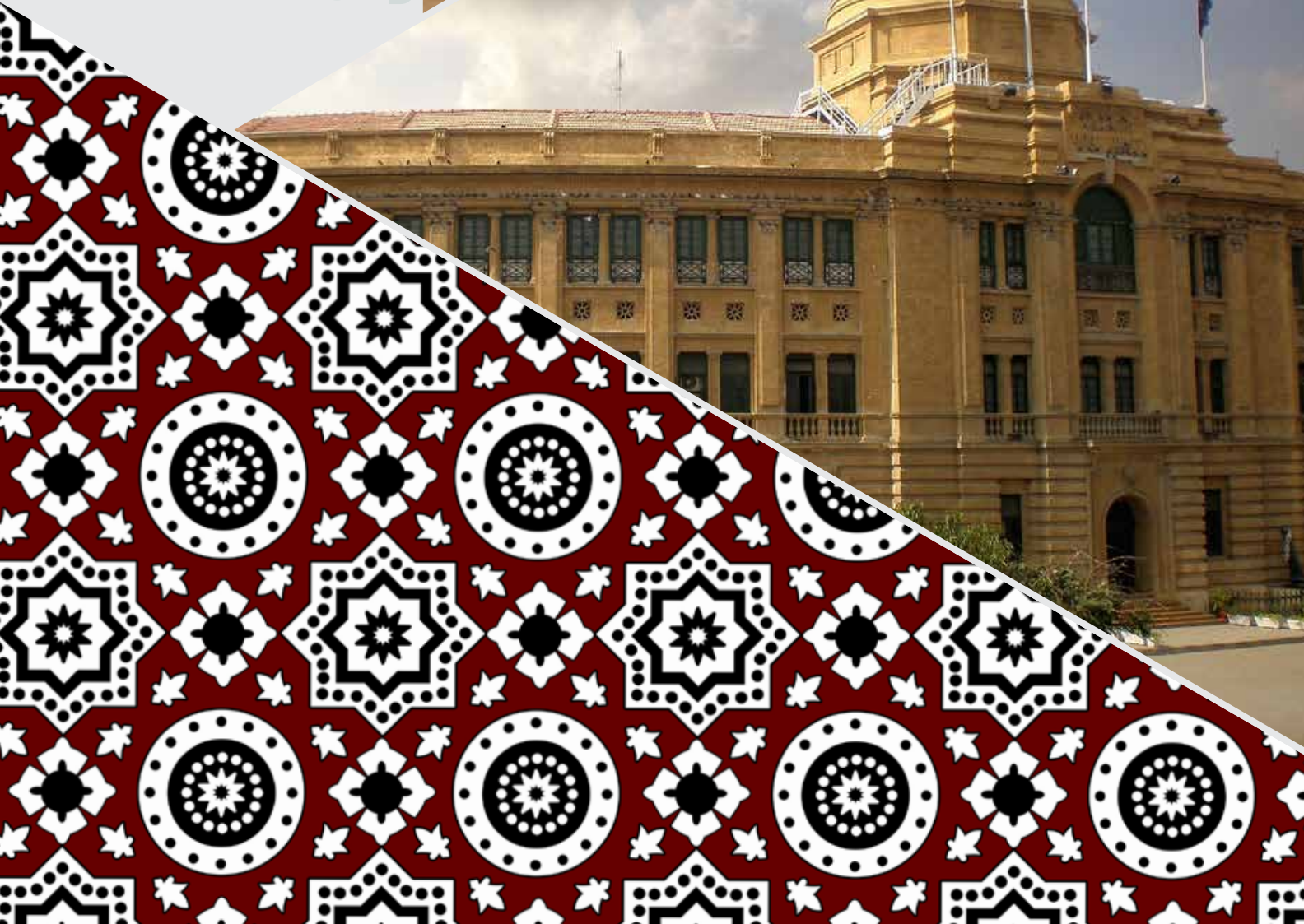

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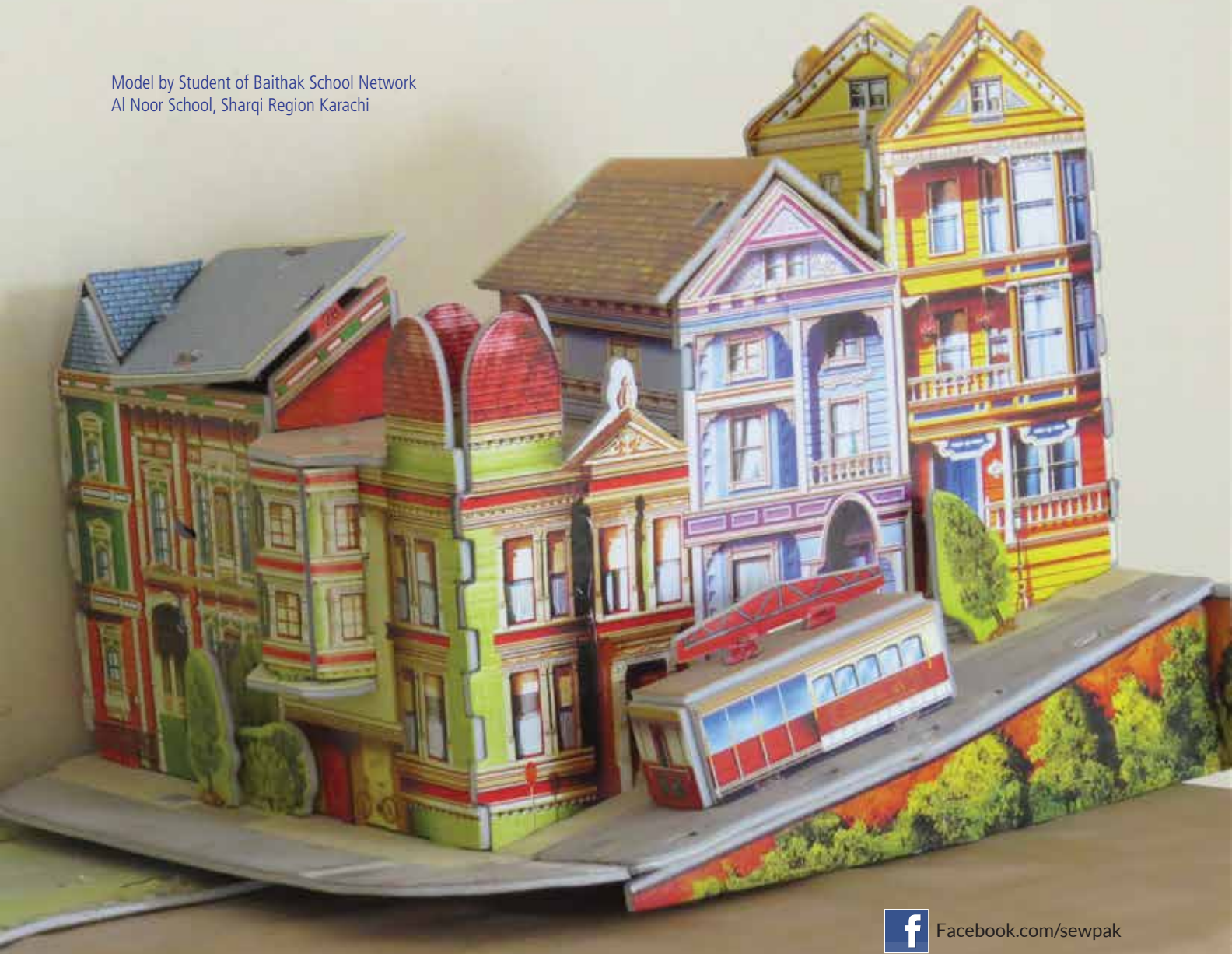
