Precis of Baithak 1996 - 2019



Society for Educational Welfare (SEW) is a not-for-profit organization and registered at Societies Act. SEW having National Tax Number (NTN) and Tax Exemption status at Federal Board of Revenue (FBR). SEW is certified at Pakistan Centre for Philanthropy (PCP) and case in process for registration at Economic Affairs Division (EAD), Government of Pakistan.

Baithak School Network is brand name of SEW schools. Since establishment in 1996, SEW provided primary education to about 5 million children at less privileged segments of Pakistan. Currently over 18000 students are enrolled in 142 Baithak Schools at all four provinces of Pakistan. These schools are not only giving education to students but providing job opportunities for local females. Around 1000 females are teaching at Baithak schools. Capacity building and training is significant need due to hiring of local teachers. They mostly do not have any experience of teaching in their past so upbringing and inculcating teaching skills is the most important function of the organization.

Interaction with parents and community in an integral part of the scheme. Providing course books to poor BSN students is another feature. Bridging the 5th graders with secondary schools is duty of

Principal. She enrolled her primary passed BSN students at nearby secondary school and make follow up to ensure their further education. Also, from this year there are 5 selected Baithak Schools are giving secondary education as pilot project. Course books of AFAQ publishers are using at Baithak School Network.

To establish a new school, we survey the location, find-out the targeted poor population, acquire rented premises, hire and trained the staff and get admissions of students. Cluster Coordinators is a designated supervisor who visit and monitor the schools on regular basis. She is responsible to bridge the schools with head office. SEW head office is situated at Karachi and contain departments; Schools Department, Resource Mobilization, Human Resource, Finance and General Admin. Executive Director is the leading position at head office.

Obviously our efforts and numbers are not on large scale, nor significant but we making efforts at our level best. The aim of our efforts is to build more educated and capable nation for prosperous and peaceful Pakistan. We offer to philanthropists, well-wisher and donors for joining hands for this noble cause.

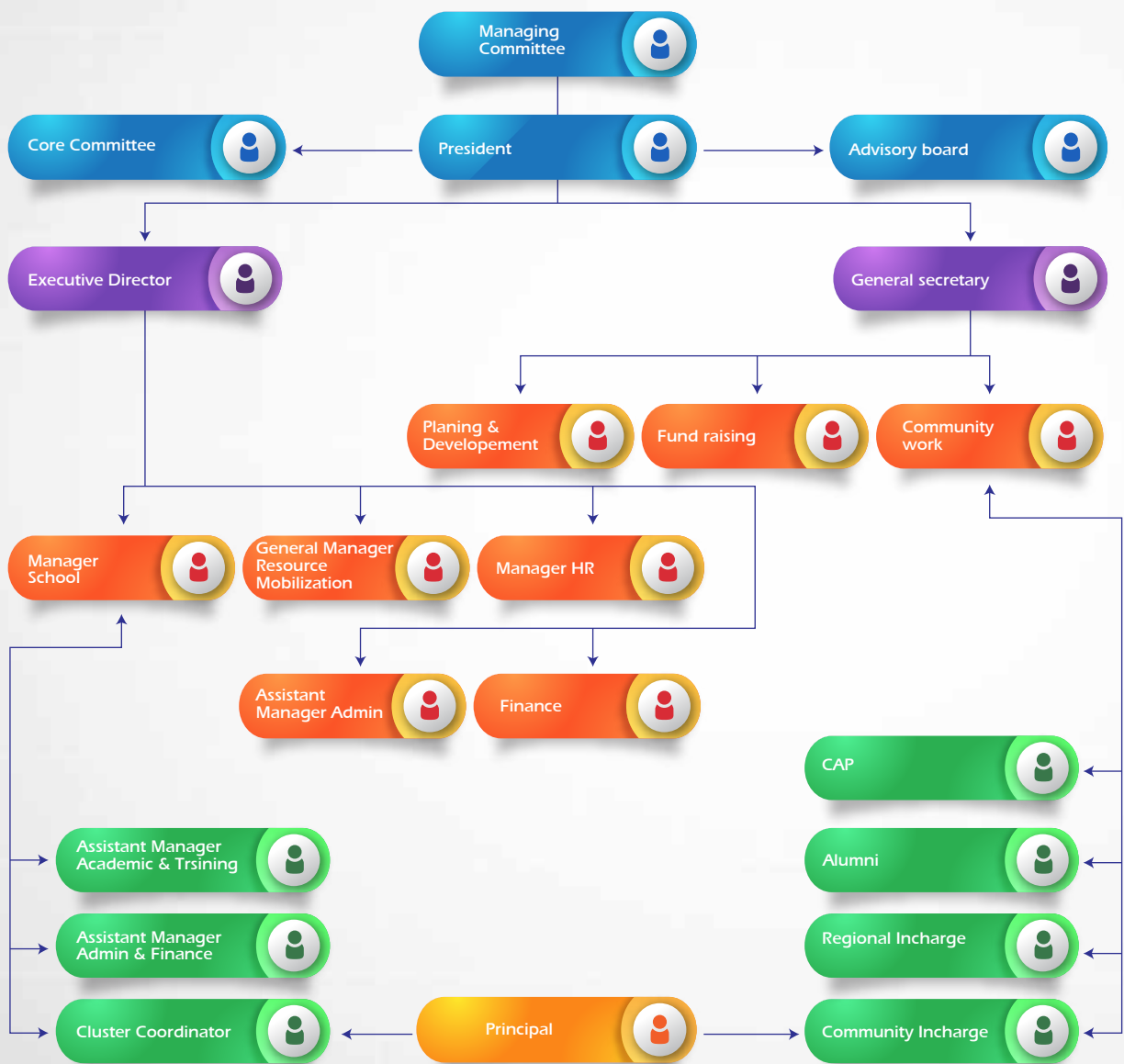

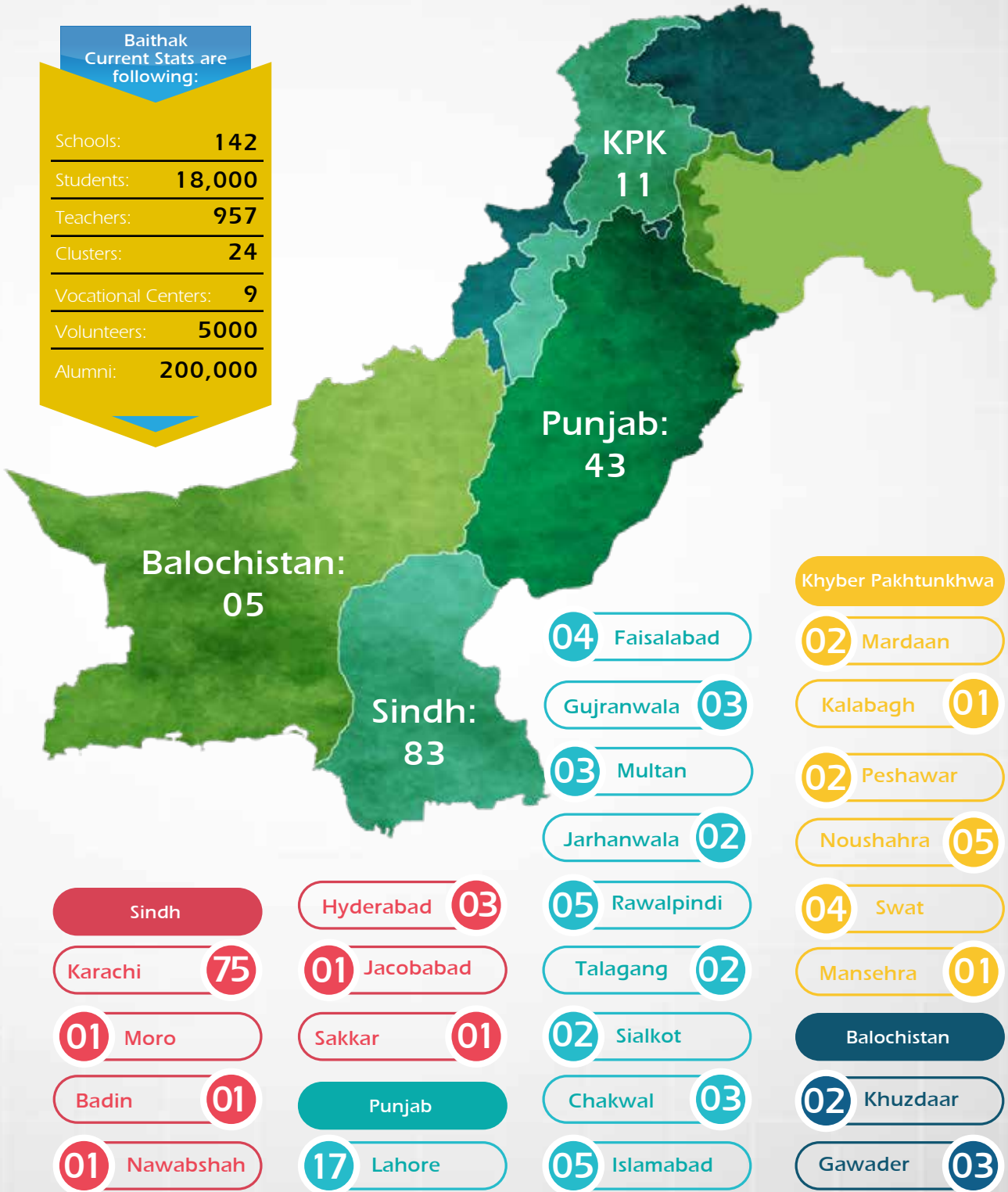
Organogram 2019

Formal and Informal Education

Educational Awareness in the less privileged urban, rural, politically instable and disaster struck areas is provided by SEW through formal structured age-wise educational setups and informally in camps and tents for internally displaced persons.

Academic Development

Academic research through assessment at ground level formulates our unified syllabus, teacher's capacity building program and other supportive publications. This year the revision of curriculum for the next five years has been planned on the basis of this extensive research.



Training and Capacity Building of Teaching & Non-Teaching Staff

Training is an integral function in education sector. SEW is focusing and giving special attention for capacity building of teachers. R&D conduct training itself and with the help of professional individuals and organizations. Award ceremony held to praise the trainers and organizations for their valuable services at BSN. Executive Director Asif Hussain paid thanks to The ILM Foundation, Association For Academic Quality, Character Education Foundation, Educators Development Institute and Mr Saad Zuberi. President SEW Nighat Malik awarded the shields among them.



Vocational Training

S.E.W vocational centres offer 3-6 months courses where girls from lower middle / middle class can develop essential skills such as sewing. It helps acquiring skills to utilize as their source of income.

The Vocational Institutions also add value to Baithak School Network by providing school uniforms to the students at Baithak.

Community Awareness Specially for Mothers

The program offers free counselling to mothers of students at Baithak on monthly basis Cleanliness, health and hygiene and importance of education are focal topics and have evident marks of improved family life. This year S.E.W. conducted programs in different regions to build better and prosperous community.



Collaborated Community Development Program

In order to connect these underprivileged students with other students of privileged areas, S.E.W conducts collaborative programs with other private educational institutions and encourage their students to visit Baithak Schools. Such programs help bridge the gaps between students with different mind-sets and are prove to be a great source of learning for new generation.

A six week academic session program was held this year with three Baithak Schools of S.E.W in coordination with Foundation Public School (FPS). It helped to improve and guide students in their academic areas as well as groomed them with extracurricular activities. At the end of this much appreciated CCDP program, a closing ceremony was organized by FPS students presenting their efforts to polish the skills of Baithak Students. FPS students were also awarded with certificates by S.E.W. based on their performance and involvement.

Friends with Book program

The second phase of library setup started this year after the successful completion of the first phase last year, where new libraries were opened and previous ones reinforced. 16 computer labs were successfully established to equip the children in their I.T skills.

Health and Hygiene

Due to lack of education and finances in underprivileged areas, most of the people have zero knowledge and understanding to take care of their health and hygiene. S.E.W has always tried to promote the importance of health through different events, talks and by providing basic health facilities to our students and their families.

Eye Screening at BSN Karachi

"Prevention of Blindness (POB) Hospital" and "Society for Educational Welfare" are collaborating for eye screening at Baithak School Network Karachi chapter. Doctors and paramedics are visiting the Baithak School campuses and organizing eye screening camps. About 1500 students out of 7560 have been examined till now with 100+ cases being referred to the hospital for further investigation or treatment.

Law & order, drugs, poverty, bad infrastructure are the commonalities of Lyari and Jiwani. SEW focussed to enroll more students by establishing 14 more schools at Lyari and Jiwani. It will make them cluster of 10 schools at each area. About 2000 students will get benefits in total by next year.

Lyari

197 students are enrolled in 3 baithak schools at Lyari, we are committed to add 7 more schools in 2019-2020 to get 1000 enrollment overall.

Jiwani

Currently 3 Baithak Schools exist at Jiwani in which 11 teachers are educating 194 students. In session 2019-2020 we aimed addition of 7 schools to enroll 700 more students

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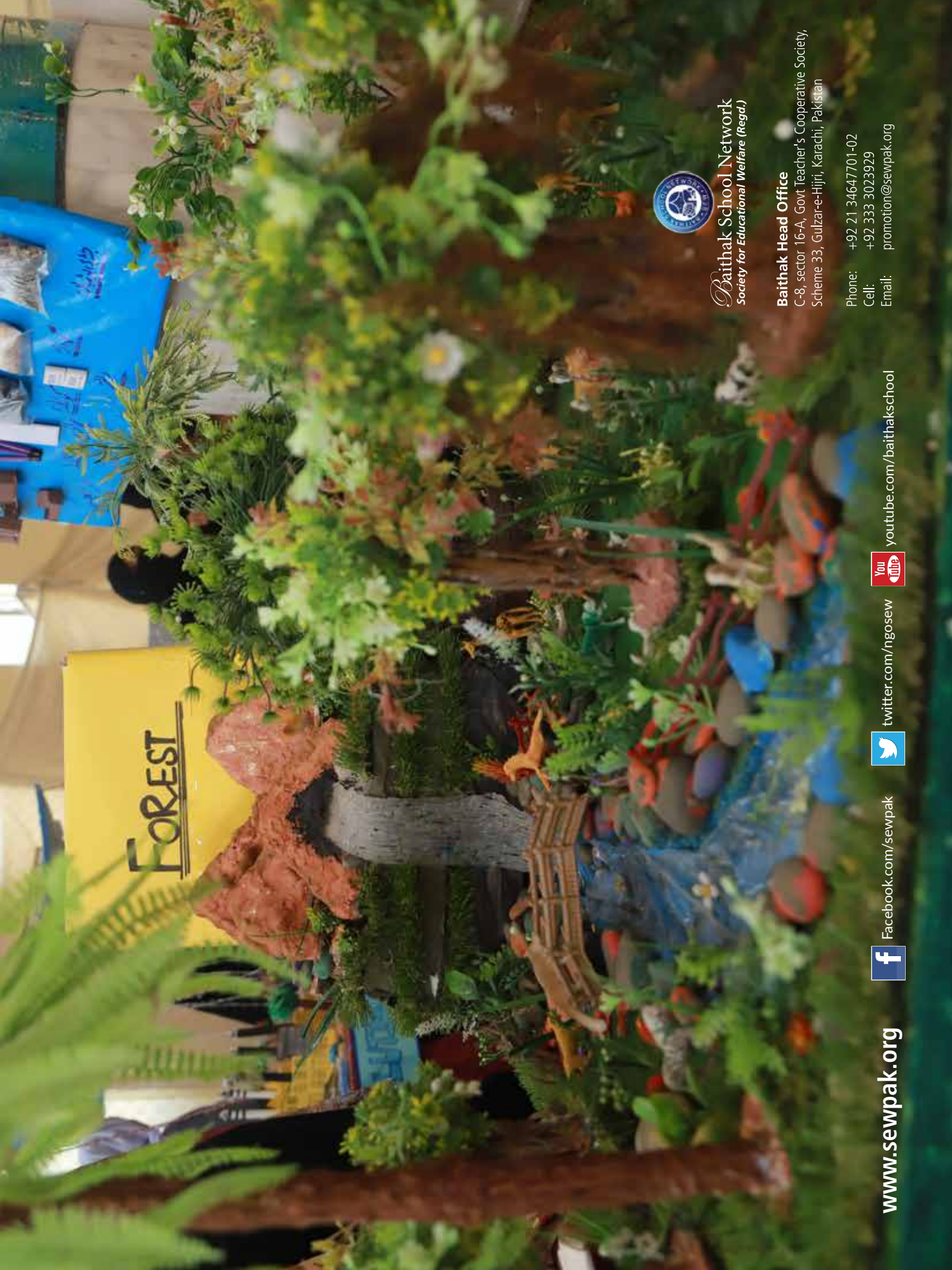
